CSIT Football 2010

PREAMBLE

- This regulation refers to the CSIT Championships and Technical Commissions' general regulations adopted at the CSIT General Assembly in Vantaa in 2003 and amended at the Congress of Marseilles in 2005 and Tel Aviv 2008. It cannot derogate from them.
- All activities of the CSIT, including its championships, are opened to the members of the CSIT Unions, observer members Unions and members of the international Confederations with which the CSIT has signed cooperation agreements according to CSIT general regulations : COPADET (American Continent) / BAWA (Balkan region) and OSTA (Central Africa).
- The CSIT Sporting activities (championships, training, tournaments, rallies, etc.) are organised under the responsibility of Technical Commissions by sport.
- The Technical Commissions are composed of one representative from each CSIT Union participating in the corresponding sport. They elect their own president and secretary for 3 years depending on conditions written in the CSIT general regulations.

SPECIFIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CSIT WORLD SPORTS GAMES IN TALLINN 2010

Art. 1 – ORGANIZERS :

The International Labour Sports Confederation - CSIT, with the Estonian Sport for All Union - KALEV, organize the CSIT international soccer championship in Tallinn from July 1 to July 8, 2010.

Art. 2 – PARTICIPANTS :

CSIT Unions and its observer members Unions, members from Confederations having signed partnership agreements with the CSIT, can participate with the authorization of the organising committee.

Each Union can send just one team.

A delegation shall not have more than 22 members as followed :

- 18 players
- 1 coach
- 1 assistant coach
- 1 referee
- head of delegation

Complete listing of all members (first and last name) must be given with registration.

Art. 3 – CHAMPIONSHIP ORGANIZATION

3-1 : Teams are divided in 3 or 4 pools of 3 or 4 teams with the following top seeds (based on the last championship held in Rimini (Italy) in 2008)

- SESI(Brazil),
- DAI (Denmark),
- AICS (ITALY),

3-2 : A draw will place the remaining teams in the 3 pools, taking into account that :

- Unions from the same country cannot be in the same pool,
- balanced geographical distribution between pools (based on continents or regions from a continent, for example : Balkans, Baltic countries)

3-3 : Pool Round :

- Pool games will be held on Tuesday, July 1st, Wednesday, July 2nd and Thursday, July 3rd.
- Games will start at 5 pm 30 on 6 different fields (6 games per day / one on each field).

3-4 : Classification round :

- July 2th-5th : kick off at 15 pm 00
- semifinals
- games for 5th/6th– 7th/8th – 9th/10th – 11th/12th place
- 7 July 7th : game for 3rd/4th place (at 13 pm) and final (at 15 pm)

3-5 : points per game :

- 3 points for a win / 0 point for a loss;
- In case of a draw at the end of regulation time : penalty kicks determine the winning team (no extra-time) : the winning team score 2 points, the losing team 1 point;

3-6 : Semifinals qualifying methods:

- Top team of each pool and the best second ranked team are qualified for the semifinals.
- If two or more teams are equal on points on completion of the pool round, the following criteria are applied in the order:
 - 1) results of the games played among the teams in question,
 - 2) superior total goal difference
 - 3) superior goal difference from the game played between the two teams
 - 4) fair-play challenge points (numbers of yellow and red cards)
 - 5) draw

Art. 4 – FIELDS

The championship will be held on the following fields :

Appointed by KALEV

Finals will be held at a stadium appointed by KALEV.

Art. 5 – RULES

- Games are played in 2 x 45 minutes with no extra time.
- 18 players can be on the game sheet and play during the game.
- Unlimited number of substitutions
- A player who came out of a game for substitution can come back in during the same game (revolving substitution) ;
- Substitution is allowed during stoppage time.
- Substitutions take place on the centre line, where the benches are located, under the control of the game supervisor and / or the line referee.
- Teams must have at least 2 sets of jerseys of different colors.
- For any other regulations, FIFA regulations apply.

Art. 6 – REFEREEING

- 3 referees will officiate on every game (1 field referee and 2 line referees)
- CSIT championship referees are members of the participant Unions, completed by KALEV referees. Referees must have diplomas from CSIT Unions and officiate in the highest level of championship of their Union. Otherwise, referees can be members of the national soccer federation of their home country.
- Official delegates for each match are appointed by the CSIT soccer technical commission with the approval of the KALEV National League.

Art. 7 – PLAYERS IDENTIFICATION CONTROL

- Players must be 16 and older.
 - At least 15 minutes before kickoff, the head of delegation must give to the referee the players list (18 max.) by ascending order of jersey numbers and the list of staff member allowed on the bench.
 - The head of delegation must furnish identity cards of all players and staff members.
 - The referee checks the identity of all players (with an ID card), in the presence of the captain or head of delegation of the opposing team if they wish.
 - At the end of the game, referees indicate in the game sheet possible cards and remarks. captains and game delegates sign the game sheet.
 - Suspended players from previous games (red card) or ejected from the championship (temporarily or permanently) for a major offence can not participate at the game.

Art. 8 – TEAM DELAY BEFORE A GAME

- A 15 minutes delay is authorized. Beyond that delay, the team can be declared forfeited (lost game) by the game official delegate on his own appreciation and in agreement with the appeal commission. The team that forfeits scores 0 point. The opposing team scores 2 points.
- If the delay does not concern all the players, a team can start a game with at least 7 players.

The referee checks the identity of the players and fills the game sheet (given by the head of delegation or, if missing, by one of the player). The referee can start the game. When the other players arrive during the game, the official delegate checks their identity before they may enter the game. They enter the game like a normal substitution.

Art. 9 – PENALTIES

- The first yellow card (white card) gives a dismissal for 10 minutes, the second yellow card: the player have to leave the game.
- If two yellow cards are given during one or more games, the player will be suspended for the next game.
- In case of a direct red card, the player is ejected from the game and at least automatically suspended for the next game.
- Depending on the gravity of the act leading to the yellow or red card, the player can receive a more important penalty from the appeal commission : from a 2 games suspension up to a definitive exclusion from the championship.
- Points scored by teams are automatically awarded based on the game results except in the case of an appeal commission deliberation, depending on events that may have occurred, related by the referees' or official game delegates or claims from heads of delegation.
- In that case, the appeal commission can either confirm the game score, change the score (including to a loss (0 – 3), or give disciplinary penalties. In very particular cases, the commission may cancel the game and ask that it be replayed.

Art. 10 – APPEAL COMMISSION

- The appeal commission is composed of :
 - Mr. Jens Jorgen Nygaard (CSIT Soccer TC president – Denmark)
 - Mr. Felipe Fagundes (CSIT soccer CST secretary - Brasil)
 - A manager of the KALEV National League (Estonia)
- Its missions are :
 - check the suspended players list
 - rule on all disputes taking place during games based on referees' reports on game sheets or written claims by a head of delegation following a game (given no later than the evening of the game)
 - only heads of delegation may produce a written claim.
 - Claims may not concern application of game regulations or technical decisions (the referee's decisions are sovereign).

Art. 11 – ORGANISATIONAL MEETINGS

- An organisational meeting is scheduled on Friday, July 2th at 09.30 am (in one of the hotel where the soccer teams are staying in Tallinn – name and address will be available on location).
- The presence of all heads of delegation, coaches, referees of teams taking part in the championship is mandatory. If a team is missing, it may be penalized by a lost game (at the discretion of the appeal commission).
- During this meeting, everyone in charge of the tournament and team staff will be introduced.
- All the necessary informations will be given (fields, time schedule, transportation accommodations, regulations, jerseys' colors, game sheets...).
- Official game delegates and referees will be appointed.
- The appeal commission will be settled and the appeal procedures will be given anew.

Art. 12 – OFFICIAL MEETING OF THE CSIT SOCCER TECHNICAL COMMISSION

- The CSIT soccer technical commission will meet on Wednesday, July 7th à 10:00 am, with the following agenda :
 - evaluation of the Tallinn championship
 - possible changes of the CSIT soccer regulations on proposal of the TC president or heads of delegations.
 - planning proposal for future CSIT soccer events : 11 men soccer, indoor soccer, 7 men soccer...
 - Election of the Commission president and secretary for the next 3 years (2010/2013).
- Managers of the KALEV National Football League in charge of the championship, all heads of delegation, coaches, referees must be present.

Art. 13 – RULE NOT DEFINED BY THOSE REGULATIONS

Concerning rules not defined by this document, the CSIT soccer technical commission president and secretary are in charge of all necessary decisions. They may contact the CSIT sport director if necessary.
