CHESS TECHNICAL COMMISSION

1. Every Team match is composed by 4 games (4 players of each team and one reserve, that is the player no. 5, to be mentioned before the match starts). If one member of the main team (4) is not playing, the "reserve" covers board no. 4 and the other members shall play by the initial order (to be indicated before the championship starts by the delegate or the captain); But, of course 4 players are enough.
2. So, before the start of the championship there is a team delegate/ or captain meeting with the championship director and arbiter for rules to be adopted, which are depending of the number of teams in the competition;
3. All chess tournament players know the systems; they are the same all over the world (Swiss or All play All);
4. If there is an odd number of participating teams, the organizer may present a "B-team", that must play in the first round with team A. This, in order to avoid that in each round there is a team without play; and team A against B, in order to avoid misunderstandings about sportsmanships...
