Technical Commission/ Commission Technique Basketball

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PREAMBULE

- This regulation refers to the CSIT Championships and Technical Commissions' general regulations adopted at the latest CSIT Congress.

It cannot derogate from these regulations.

- CSIT Championships are an open event and welcome non-member organisations, partners, governmental bodies, trade unions and companies as well.

- CSIT organises amateur championships and has Fair Play as one of its most important aims. CSIT Championships are strictly open for amateur sportsmen. To participate in CSIT Championships the defined eligibility criteria per sport must be respected

- All activities of the CSIT, including its championships are open to the members of the CSIT Unions, observer members Unions and members of the international Confederations which CSIT has signed cooperation agreements according to CSIT general regulations: COPADET (American Continent) / BAWA (Balkan region) and ALSO (Central Africa); also non CSIT members and company sports teams can participate in the CSIT Championships.

- The CSIT Sporting activities (championships, training, tournaments, rallies, etc.) are organised under the responsibility of Technical Commissions by sport.

1. BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS

1-1 PERIODICITY / AGE GROUPS

CSIT Basketball Championship, **men** and **women**, take place:

Years in between CSIT World Sports Games

- **SENIORS:** 19 years and older

During CSIT World Sports Games

- **JUNIORS:** up to 18 years old
- **SENIORS:** 19 years till 40 years old
40 years and older

1-2 ORGANISATION / REGULATIONS

- Championships are held in pools followed by, (depending on the number of teams involved), quarterfinals or direct semi-finals and final.
- Each team will play at least 4 games during the championship but no more than 2 games per day.
- Championships follow FIBA regulations (see: www.fiba.com) (technical instructions and regulations, game rules)
- At least four (4) member-unions or at least three (3) member-unions and at least one (1) not-CSIT member union must participate in a CSIT Championship. In case of less than four (4) participating parties the Championship can take place but without being published as an official CSIT classification.
- Championships cannot last more than five (5) days (days of arrival and departure not included).

2. PARTICIPATION CONDITIONS

2-1 PARTICIPATING TEAMS

- More than one team per gender per Union can participate.

2-2 MAXIMUM PARTICIPANTS

Each team shall not have more than 15 members:

- 12 players
- 1 coach
- 1 referee
- 1 team manager / head of the official union delegation

When a union sends a male team and a female team, the delegation shall not have more than 31 members:

- 12 female players
- 12 male players
- 2 coaches (1 for each team)
- 2 referees
- 2 team managers (one for each team)
- 1 head of the official union delegation

Every team more than 2 will raise the number of 31 by 15 or multiples of 15.

2-3 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

A player can participate in CSIT Basketball games when he is not registered as a professional player in his country or in an other country.

A player cannot participate in CSIT Basketball games if he plays in the national team of his country.

A player cannot participate in CSIT Basketball games if he plays in the first two leagues of his country, even if he is not registered as a professional player.

- Fair Play

CSIT championships are organised according the principals of Fair Play. During CSIT Championships athletes, persons and teams can be awarded for acts of Fair Play.

Fair Play regulations can be found in the CSIT Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations edition 2016 and later, Chapter 5.

4. REGISTRATION / FUNDING

4-1 REGISTRATION DELAY

- Provisional registration: at least four (4) months before the championship starts.

- Final registration: at least two (2) months before the championship starts.

- Final registration must include the list of all delegation members (first name - last name - birth date - gender - function)

4-2 COVERING CHARGES

- Unions pay for all travelling cost to the city where the championship is organised (round way).

- The organizer Union shall take charge of the following issues:

- Transportation of delegations from the airport or train station to the hotel on the day of arrival and departure

- Local transportation during the stay depending on the program (between hotels and sport facilities in particular)

- Full board accommodation (double room, breakfast, 2 meals a day)

- Every participant Union shall pay a registration fee as determined at the latest CSIT Congress to the organising Union for each member of the delegation.

- By the time of issuing of the provisional application forms, the organizer Union can collect an advance payment of 50% of the total amount to be paid by the participating Union, the remaining amount being paid at the time of the permanent registration or on the day of arrival, final deadline.

4-3 CANCELLATION POLICY

- Each participating Union is supposed, with preliminary registration, to pay in 50% of the total due amount. If cancellation occurs in the period between preliminary and definitive registration, 10% of the

deposited sum is retained by the organizing Union to be used for covering of its operative current expenses, and the rest of the deposit is refunded to the Union cancelling its participation.

- With definitive registration, the whole sum is due to be paid in. If cancellation of a union/person occurs after definitive registration and no later than one month before the beginning of the respective sports event, 50% of the total sum is retained by the organizing Union. In the case of last-minute (less than one (1) month) cancellation, 80% of the total sum is retained by the organizing Union and the remaining 20% will be refunded to the Union. Cancellation within two (2) weeks prior to Championships, no refund will be conducted.

- The organiser will reserve the right of cancellation if the minimum criteria of participating parties is not accomplished according Chapter 4.B.4. of the Technical Commissions and Championships General Regulations.

5. ORGANISATION / PREPARATION

5-1 ORGANISING COMMITTEE

The organising committee is in charge of the preparation and management of the championships during its duration. It is composed of organiser Union representatives and of the CSIT Basketball Technical Commission chairman and secretary.

5-2 INVITATIONS

The organising committee sends championships invitations to every CSIT Unions (and partners), company sports organisations and guests etc. at least nine (9) months before the start of the championship. Invitations must include this information:

- Participation;
- Sporting activities, social and cultural program;
- Referees needed;
- Boarding facilities;
- Arrival and departure accommodations;
- If possible, general program.

5-3 PREPARATION

Depending on the situation and with the CSIT Sports Director's authorization, a member of the technical commission (chairman or secretary) can visit the location

where the championship is organised, at least three (3) months before it starts, to settle with the organising Union planning and preparation of the championship. Travelling expense can be covered under certain conditions by the funds awarded to the Basketball Technical Commission by the CSIT.

5-4 REPORT

Within seven (7) days after the Championships the secretary of the Technical Commission will send the results of the Basketball Championship to the Sports Director and office of CSIT. No later than one (1) month after the end of the championship, the Technical Commission secretary must send a report about the championships and all the sport results plus the minutes of the TC meetings to the members of the Basketball Technical Commission, to the Unions, to the Sports Director and to the office of CSIT.

6. REFEREEING

- Each Union must provide one referee per participating team. Unions who do not apply this rule must pay the organiser Union an amount specified in CSIT regulations to cover substitute referees fees.

- The referees are not allowed to assume another position within their own delegation.

- The Technical Commission decides of the refereeing conditions according to the discipline needs based on FIBA regulations.

- Referees must be official referees of their own Union on national or international level. If necessary, a Union can contact referees from its country National Federation or from the FIBA.

7. APPEAL COMMITTEE

- The Appeal Committee is composed of:
 - The CSIT Technical Commission's chairman
 - The CSIT Technical Commission's secretary
 - A person among the participating Unions. Such member shall not participate in the appeals in which his own Union would be involved.

- An appeal committee is appointed for every championship in agreement with FIBA regulations.

- Appeals for technical reasons must be brought to the attention on the appeal committee no later than half an hour after the incident, providing all the necessary information.

8. AWARDS

- The first three (3) teams will be awarded a cup and medals: gold for first place, silver for second place, bronze for third place. Each player of the team, the coach and the head of delegation will receive a medal.

- These medals should not measure more than 5 centimetres in diameter and less than 2,5 millimetres wide. The CSIT logo must appear on one side of the coin and on the other side, the name, date and venue of the championship and maybe logo of the Union. The organising Union is in charge of providing and expenses.

- Each of the other team will receive a souvenir medal: each player, coach, head of delegation and referees.

- These medals should not measure more than 5 centimetres in diameter. The CSIT logo must appear on one (1) side of the coin and on the other side, the name, date and venue of the championship. The organising Union is in charge of providing and expenses.

9. TECHNICAL COMMISSION MEETINGS

- The Technical Commission chairman or secretary is in charge of convening a meeting of the commission before and at the end of the championship. A summon containing the date and agenda will be sent to all Unions at least three (3) months ahead of schedule. The chairman, the secretary, Unions representatives, heads of delegation participate. Referees, coaches of participant Unions, members of the organising committee are invited.

- A preparation and information meeting is organised before the championships under the responsibility of the chairman (and/or Technical Committee secretary and head of the organising committee from the

organising Union) to inform all delegations of the planning of the championship, to appoint referees to matches, to bring clarifications to regulations if necessary ... to make the event a success.

- The purpose of the meeting after the championships is to evaluate the championship, to proceed with the modifications of the present regulations if necessary, to prepare future events (planning of next championships) and elections, to take into account the reports on the CSIT congress.

- Once every 4 years (the year of the CSIT electing congress), the chairman and the secretary of the Technical Commission are elected during the last meeting before the congress. The chairman or secretary must send with the convocation to the meeting a call for candidatures for both functions (at least three (3) months before the meeting). The election follows championship and Technical Committee general regulations

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
